## PROGRAM NOTES

Led Zeppelin was an English rock band formed in 1968 by Jimmy Page (guitar), Robert Plant (vocals), John Paul Jones (bass guitar, keyboards, mandolin) and John Bonham (drums). The band has sold an estimated 200 million albums worldwide, including over 100 million albums in the United States, and had all of their original studio albums reach the top 10 of the Billboard album chart in the U.S.

After disbanding in 1980, the band continues to be held in high regard for their artistic achievements, commercial success, and broad influence. *Rolling Stone* magazine has described Led Zeppelin as “the heaviest band of all time” and “the biggest band of the ‘70s.”
